# Carolina Mug Rugs





# South Carolina Mug Rug

## MATERIALS:

- [1] ACSH Collectible Quilt Block
- [1] fat quarter (18" × 22" ) Carolinas Cities, Grey
- [1] fat quarter (18" × 22" ) Agriculture, Peach
- 4" × 4" Moda Grunge - Papaya (Peach)
- 5" × 5" Moda Grunge - Dried Herb (SC and Leaf)
- 3" × 6" Benartex New Hue Beige (Tower)

*Seams are 1/4" unless otherwise specified.*

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

### From Carolinas Cities, Gray

Cut [1] 10-1/2" × 7-1/2"

### From Agriculture, Peach

Cut [2] 10-1/2" × 1-1/2"

Cut [2] 9-1/2" × 1-1/2"

## BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

1. Sew 10-1/2" × 1-1/2" strips to each side of the gray rectangle. Press to the dark. See Figure 1.
2. Sew 9-1/2" × 1-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the Gray rectangle. Trim & Press. See Figure 2.

## APPLIQUE INSTRUCTIONS:

I like to use an applique pressing sheet to build my appliques units before fusing them to the mug rug. A pressing sheet will release a fusible adhesive once the applique is ironed to the sheet. Once the units are complete, then fuse them permanently to the mug rug and secure with an applique stitch.

1. Trace applique shapes on paper side of steam a seam or fusible web of your choice.
2. See template pattern sheet for fabric color of each applique shape.
3. Fuse fabric to wrong side of fusible web.
4. Cut out applique on traced line.
5. Build the units onto the pressing sheet fusing each layer in place as you go
6. Once your units are complete and cool, peel them from the pressing sheet
7. Choose [1] ACSH Collectible block, trim to 4" and applique in place.
8. Following the placement guide, position applique units to the quilt top and secure with applique stitch of your choice.

## QUILT BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

1. Layer mug rug with batting and backing.
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind using your favorite binding method.



# North Carolina Mug Rug

## MATERIALS:

- [1] ACSH Collectible Quilt Block
- [1] fat quarter (18" × 22" ) Carolinas Cities, Blue
- [1] fat quarter (18" × 22" ) Agriculture, Pink
- 8" × 3" Black Dress (NC and parts of lighthouse)
- 8" × 5" Moda Grunge - White Paper (lighthouse and building)
- Small scrap tan fabric (chimney)
- Scrap fabric grey (roof)

*Seams are 1/4" unless otherwise specified.*

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

### From Carolinas Cities, Blue

Cut [1] 10-1/2" × 7-1/2"

### From Agriculture, Pink

Cut [2] 10-1/2" × 1-1/2"

Cut [2] 9-1/2" × 1-1/2"

## BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

1. Sew 10-1/2" × 1-1/2" strips to each side of the blue rectangle. Press to the dark. See Figure 1.
2. Sew 9-1/2" × 1-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the blue rectangle. Trim & Press. See Figure 2.

## APPLIQUE INSTRUCTIONS:

I like to use an applique pressing sheet to build my appliques units before fusing them to the mug rug. A pressing sheet will release a fusible adhesive once the applique is ironed to the sheet. 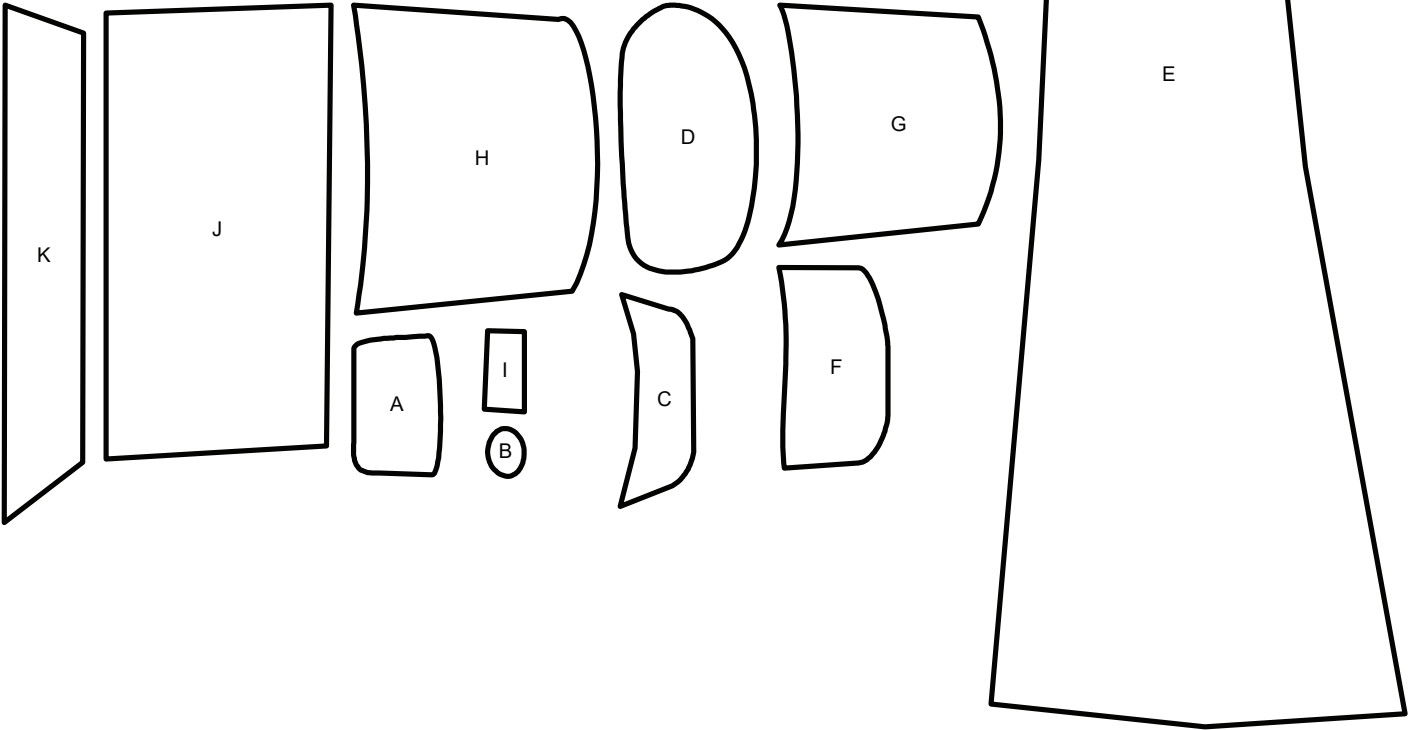
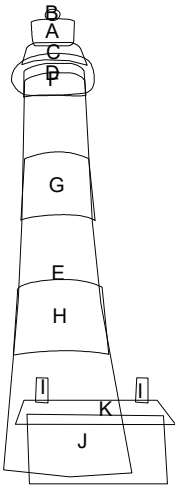
1. Trace applique shapes on paper side of steam a seam or fusible web of your choice.

7. Choose [1] ACSH Collectible block, trim to 4" and applique in place.
8. Following the placement guide, position applique units to the quilt top and secure with applique stitch of your choice.

## QUILT BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

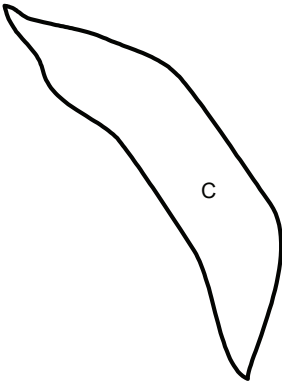
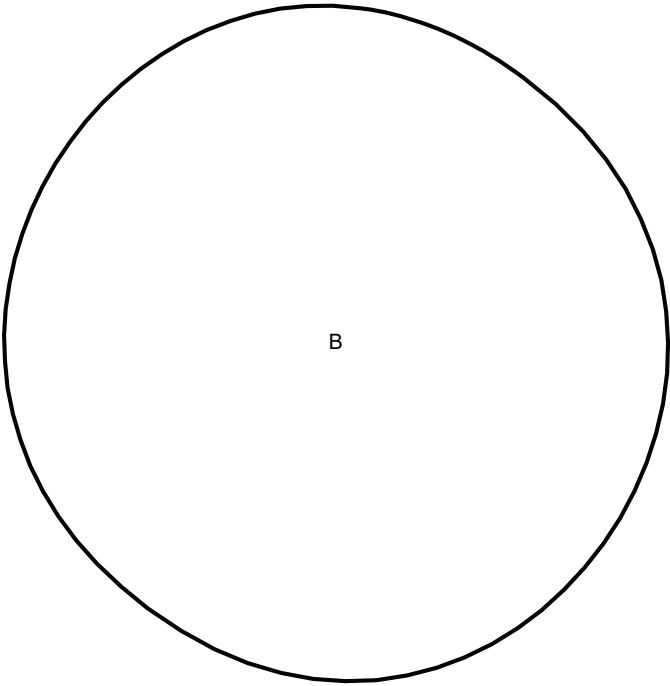
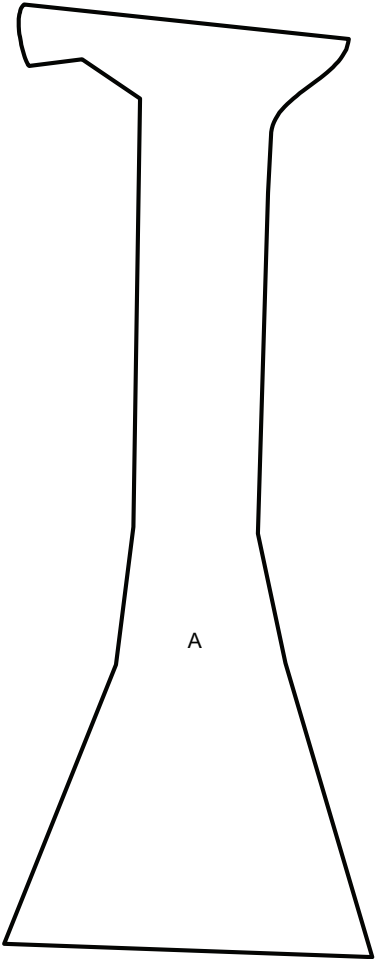
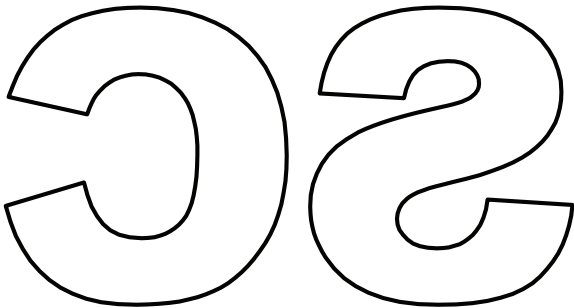
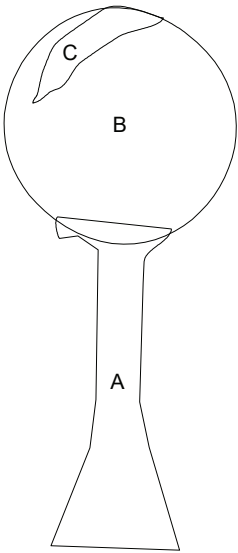
1. Layer mug rug with batting and backing.
